
The Olympic Games

Modern Olympic Games Symbols


- 1894: The Motto: "Citius, Altius, Fortius"

- 4 billion potential worldwide TV audience




London 2012 - Paralympic Games

Applicants will be required to go through a selection, assessment and evaluation process

 Around 1,000 volunteers are required for this role
