Community and Lesser Taught Languages Project

Highlights of 07/08 COLT Launch

The Routes into Languages North West project was launched officially on May 8th 2008 in the Capitol Theatre, Manchester Metropolitan University.

MMU Vice Chancellor Professor John Brooks opened proceedings and gave a warm welcome to the collection of mainstream and supplementary school teachers, city councillors, consulate personnel, students, consortia affiliates and members of the northwest community. He was followed by the night's keynote speaker, Manchester's former Lord Mayor and Councillor for

Cheetham, Mohammed Afzal Khan, who spoke passionately about the need to promote community languages.

The evening's entertainment was provided by two local supplementary schools. The Huaxia Chinese School dazzled the audience with their interpretation of the Monkey King legend followed by a traditional Chinese fan dance. The

Hijra Arabic School then impressed with their Arabian fashion show, displaying some fine examples of traditional outfits worn in the Arabicspeaking world.

Language Enrichment Events

Designed to encourage secondary school pupils to continue studying languages, the Language Enrichment Events turned out to be more popular than we could ever have imagined.

Five events were staged in June and July, attracting a total of 1000 Year 8 pupils from across the region.

Each event began with a talk, *Why study Languages*, calling on pupils to think about the positive aspects of learning a new language. Pupils then went on to experience language taster sessions in Arabic, Chinese, Urdu or Italian.

The most popular part of the day was the *Multi-Cultural Market*, a collection of stalls and activities hosted by local organisations and university language students. Pupils participated in Chinese Tai Chi demonstrations, made Italian masks, tried on Pakistani clothing, created henna designs, practised their chopstick ability and much more.

Feedback from the events proved them to be a huge success, with over 90% of pupils saying they thought it was 'great' or 'quite good.' Thirty-four percent said their opinion of language learning had

Teacher Training

In the summer term, we launched our Teacher Training Courses for Teachers of Arabic, Mandarin Chinese and Urdu.

These courses include two training days in teaching methodology at the Institute of Education, MMU; a visit to a partner school to observe MFL teaching in action; and an observation visit by our teacher trainers to course participants in their own schools.

The preliminary courses are still ongoing, but feedback from the first training day in July was very good, and we will be offering further courses in 08/09.

Events for Schools

This year we will develop and broaden our portfolio of events for schools to include **A-Level Days** for pupils studying Arabic, Italian, Mandarin Chinese and Urdu at AS and A2. These will be practical events, aimed at boosting the skills of A Level pupils. Students will attend two language sessions and a talk by an A Level examiner with practical tips for exam success. They will talk to our university student ambassadors about pathways into further language study and life at university.

In addition, we will offer another series of our highly successful **Language Enrichment Events** for Year 8/9 pupils.

COLT Student Ambassadors

COLT student ambassadors are undergraduate and postgraduate students at one of our partner universities, who either speak a COLT language as their mother tongue or are studying one of these languages at university.



Student ambassadors are fantastic motivators for school pupils, inspiring them in their language study. Last year, our ambassadors worked at the COLT Language Enrichment Events, where school pupils enjoyed chatting to them about their languages and cultures, as well as life at university.

This year, the role of student ambassador will be extended, and from January 09 it is hoped that student mentors will go into supplementary and mainstream schools to support the teaching and learning of community languages and act as role models for pupils.

Talks in Schools

If you have pupils in your school who speak a community or less-widely taught language and wish to gain a qualification in this language, but you do not have staff who are able to conduct oral assessments, we may be able to put you in touch with local teachers qualified to do this.

Additionally, if you are a native speaker or a teacher of one of these languages, and wish to gain training on conducting oral assessments, we will be organising an event for this in summer 09. Further details will be available nearer the time.

Teachers' Symposium
