FRENCH ON FILM LESSON PLAN



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Year Group	Year 10 – Year 13	
Overview	An introduction to contemporary French language and youth culture based on the analysis and discussion of the film <i>Petits frères</i> (1999) by Jacques Doillon. This workshop is suitable for around 15 students with small groups presenting their viewpoints on issues dealt with in the film together with film style and genre. The work is predominantly carried out in English, with some French words or phrases, if appropriate for year group.

Learning outcomes	 Analyse similarities/differences between UK students and their French counterparts using filmic representation as a springboard for discussion Recognise and use some French words and expressions Describe and analyse a film Work in a small group and present their conclusions to the rest of the group
