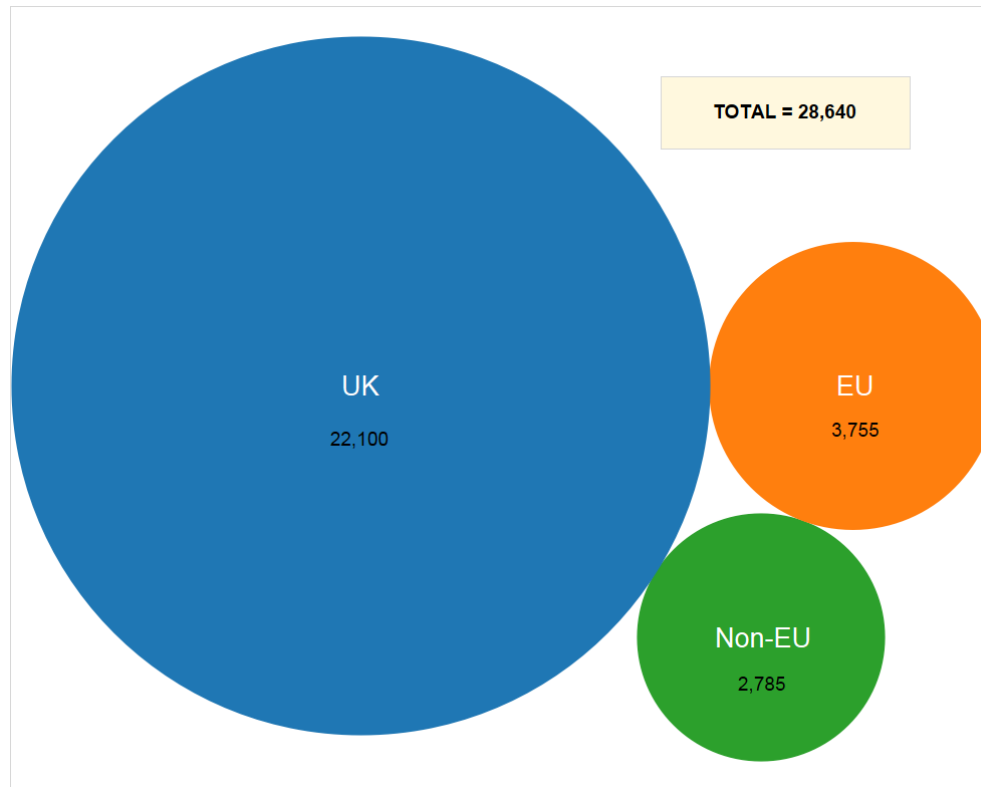

How mobile are our students?

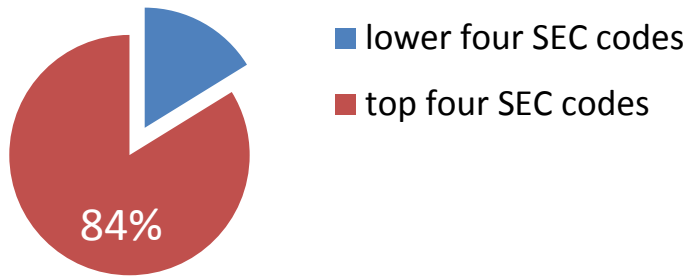
22,100 UK domiciled mobile students = **1.2%** UK domiciled students



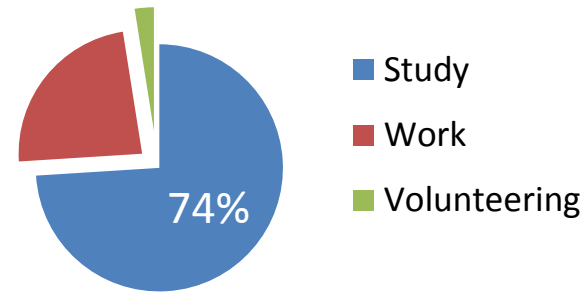
Total number of mobile students in 2013/14 by domicile (HESA)

Who goes abroad?

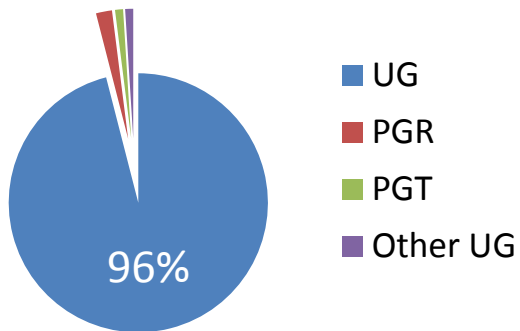

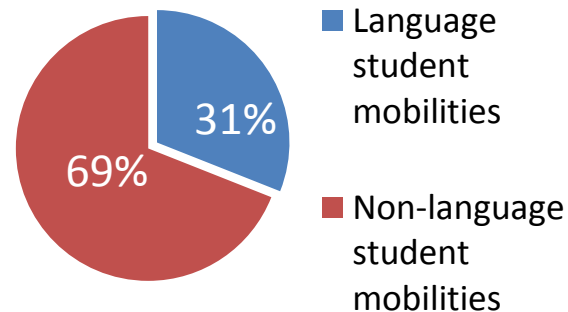

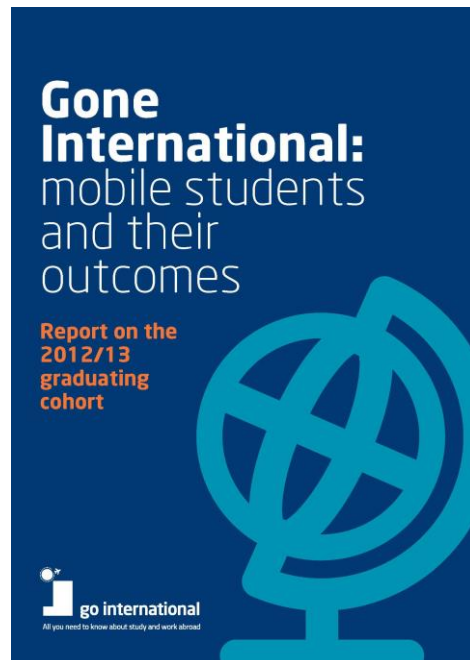

- Were more likely to enter employment in more senior roles
- Were more likely to graduate with a 1st or 2:1
