

# Languages & your future

This resource is aimed at Key Stage 3 pupils and is all about languages and the careers you can do with them. The main purpose is to inform students about the skills learnt when studying a language and the variety of options they lead to.






# Rules for card game

Players: 2 - 5 people

- Go through the list of skills & profiles first!
- Each foreign language (French, Spanish & German) is separated by a different colour.
- Shuffle all the 'job' cards, pick one and place it on your forehead without looking at it.
- Each 'job card' has a list of 3 skills that can help prompt the main guesser.
- Ask questions to the others in the group in the appropriate language to guess your profession. Take it in turns to ask/answer questions.
- Do not take more than 2 'help!' cards for each profession. Remember to use them wisely! If you pick up a blank card, ask your teacher to help you phrase a question.
- Use the vocabulary list provided to help you ask/answer questions.
- Keep playing until you've used all the 'job' cards!
