





Provision of community languages in Wales

Thank you in advance for completing this survey on **community languages in secondary schools in Wales**. The survey has been authorised by the **Welsh Assembly Government**, conducted by **CILT Cymru** and **CILT, the National Centre for Languages**, with support from **ContinYou Cymru**.

Community languages

For the purpose of this study, community languages are defined as **the languages** *in use* **in Wales other than the official languages of the country (English and Welsh)**. For example, these might include Urdu, Mandarin, Arabic, Gujerati, Polish, etc. A survey in 2005 established that in Wales, a total of 98 languages other than English and Welsh were used by school pupils.

This new survey is not concerned with provision for **foreign languages**, such as French, German or Spanish, except in cases where special provision has been made for children from communities which speak these languages.

We wish to find out from you about the **provision** for community languages at your school and any **good practice** that your school has in relation to this. By doing this, **CILT Cymru** and the **Welsh Assembly Government** will build on this and develop guidance to disseminate the good practice identified.
