



Why languages?

Quite apart from the communicative benefits offered by the knowledge of foreign languages, there are many other advantages:

- Speaking a foreign language opens the way to understanding new cultures and finding out about other nations' ways of life
- The ability to speak a foreign language fluently increases your chances in the job market and opens up a whole spectrum of careers
- Statistically, language graduates have lower rates of unemployment than graduates of most other subjects, such as engineering, business and computing. Only medicine and law have lower graduate unemployment rates than languages
- The career opportunities open to linguists extend beyond teaching and translating. Over 80 per cent of language graduates go into the private sector where they use their language skills in well-paid jobs with exciting opportunities for travel or living abroad. Areas include business services, banking, finance or retail. The role played by the EU has seen the number of opportunities increase.


How to book your place
